## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "ICE Agent Support5 Act of 2016".

(1) by striking "Attorney General" each place 1 2 that term appears and inserting "Secretary of 3 Homeland Security"; and 4 (2) in subsection (b)(3), by striking subpara-5 graph (A) and inserting the following: 6 "(A) The Secretary of the Treasury shall refund out 7 of the Immigration Enforcement Account to any appro-8 priation the amount paid out of such appropriation for 9 expenses incurred by the Secretary of Homeland Security 10 for-11 "(i) the identification, investigation, apprehen-12 sion, detention, and removal of criminal aliens, in-13 cluding the salaries and bonuses of officers and 14 agents of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforce-15 ment and the administrative costs associated with 16 the hiring of such officer and agents; 17 "(ii) the maintenance and updating of systems 18 to identify and track criminal aliens, deportable 19 aliens, inadmissible aliens, and aliens illegally enter-20 ing the United States; and 21 "(iii) the purchase of firearms, vehicles, and 22 other safety or apprehension equipment for officers 23 and agents of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement.". 24

5 Not later than 30 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall es-6 7 tablish the percentage of positions within the Enforcement 8 and Removal Operations division of U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement that shall be classified as a criminal 9 investigator position, consistent with the requirements and 10 standards for occupational classification series 1811, dedi-11 12 cated to enforcing the criminal statutory provisions of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101 et seq.). 13
