A BILL

 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Safeguard Israel Act5 of 2017".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS; SENSE OF CONGRESS.

7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-8 ings:

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(1) On December 23, 2016, President Barack
 Obama instructed United States Permanent Rep resentative to the United Nations Samantha Power
 to abstain from United Nations Security Council
 Resolution 2334, which condemns our close friend
 and ally Israel.

7 (2) The failure to veto United Nations Security
8 Council Resolution 2334, which attempts to pre9 judge the basis for negotiations, predetermine the
10 outcome of negotiations, and dictate terms and con11 ditions on this issue, was an abandonment of long12 standing policy of the United States and previous
13 commitments made to Israel.

14 (3) United Nations Security Council Resolution 15 2334 falsely claims that Israel's sovereignty over the 16 eastern part of Jerusalem and Jewish communities 17 in the West Bank are illegal under international law, 18 and that the Old City of Jerusalem, along with the 19 Temple Mount, the holiest site for the Jewish peo-20 ple, and the Western Wall are "occupied Palestinian 21 territory".

(4) United Nations Security Council Resolution
23 2334 encourages the International Criminal Court to
24 open an illegitimate formal investigation against
25 Israel.

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(5) United Nations Security Council Resolution 1 2 2334 will help to strengthen the Palestinian diplo-3 matic, economic, and legal warfare campaign against 4 Israel, particularly because of a paragraph that calls 5 upon states to make a distinction in their dealings 6 with Israel between pre-1967 Israel and Israel be-7 yond the 1967 lines, encouraging boycotts, divest-8 ments, and sanctions against Israel; 9 (6) Senate Resolution 6 and House Resolution 10 11 (115th Congress) object to United Nations Secu-11 rity Council Resolution 2334 and rebuke the Obama 12 Administration for permitting the adoption of this 13 biased, anti-Israel resolution. 14 (7) On December 16, 2016, outgoing United 15 Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon admitted 16 the United Nations bias against Israel in his final 17 address to the United Nations Security Council 18 when he stated, "Decades of political maneuverings 19 have created a disproportionate volume of resolu-20 tions, reports, and conferences criticizing Israel." 21 (8) The United Nations passes more resolutions 22 condemning Israel than any other country in the 23 world. 24 (b) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con-25 gress that4

(1) the United States needs to hold the United
 Nations accountable for its hostile actions to
 delegitimize Israel; and

4 (2) Congress should respond with concrete con5 sequences to the United Nations for the adoption of
6 United Nations Security Council Resolution 2334
7 and the overt bias of the United Nations against
8 Israel.

9 SEC. 3. RESTRICTION ON FUNDING TO THE UNITED NA-10 TIONS.

11 The United States Government may not make any 12 voluntary or assessed contributions to the United Nations 13 or any United Nations organization, including any United Nations specialized agency, fund, or program and any 14 15 other body or entity affiliated with the United Nations or founded by a United Nations treaty, convention, or agree-16 17 ment, until the President certifies to the appropriate con-18 gressional committees that United Nations Security Coun-19 cil Resolution 2334 (2016) has been repealed.

20 SEC. 4. APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE21 FINED.

In this Act, the term "appropriate congressional com-mittees" means—

(1) the Committee on Foreign Relations, theCommittee on Appropriations, and the Committee on

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1	Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the
2	Senate; and
3	(2) the Committee on Foreign Affairs, the
4	Committee on Appropriations, and the Committee on
5	Oversight and Government Reform of the House of
6	Representatives.
