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States Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, have en-1 2 gaged, or are suspected of reengaging, in terrorist 3 activities. 4 (b) Sense of Congress.—It is the sense of Con-5 gress that— 6 (1) the facility at United States Naval Station, 7 Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, is uniquely suited to detain 8 terrorists who have engaged in combat operations 9 against the United States; and 10 (2) the American public has a right to know the 11 actions of those terrorists. 12 (c) Declassification and Release of Informa-TION.—The Secretary of Defense shall, in coordination with the appropriate classification authorities and con-14 15 sistent with all applicable policies and procedures, declassify the records on past terrorist activities of all detainees 16 transferred or released from United States Naval Station, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, since November 8, 2016, and release such records to the public.
