General Information

Senator Ted Cruz, a member of the Senate Judiciary Committee and ranking member of its Constitution, Civil Rights and Human Rights Subcommittee, offers a clerkship in his Judiciary Committee office. The clerkship is open to law students or recent law school graduates. Opportunities are available in the spring, summer, and fall.

Due to the limited amount of space and resources available, there are usually more qualified applicants than positions available.

1. A cover letter detailing why you would like to be a clerk in Senator Cruz's Judiciary Committee office.
2. A resume.
3. Three letters of recommendation (letters may be emailed separately).
4. A copy of a law school transcript.
5. A writing sample.

Due Dates

*Summer clerkships: materials due January 15.

Fall semester clerkships: materials due March 1.

Spring semester clerkships: materials due October 1.

*Note: for the summer of 2014 only, the application deadline is extended to March 1.
