AMENDMENT intended to be proposed by Mr. CRUZ to the amendment (No. 2282) proposed by Mr. INHOFE

Viz:

1 At the end of subtitle C of title III, add the following:

2 **SEC. 323. REPORT ON DEPOT-LEVEL MAINTENANCE AND**
3 **REPAIR.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the
5 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of the
6 Army, in consultation with the Chief of Staff of the Army,
7 shall submit to the congressional defense committees a re-
8 port on labor hours and depot maintenance.

9 (b) ELEMENTS.—The report required under sub-
10 section (a) shall include the following elements:

1 (1) An estimate of the amount of public and
2 private funding of depot-level maintenance and re-
3 pair (as defined in section 2460 of title 10, United
4 State Code) for the Department of the Army, and
5 any other command identified by the Secretary, ex-
6 pressed by commodity group by percentage and ac-
7 tual numbers in terms of dollars and direct labor
8 hours.

9 (2) Within each category of depot level mainte-
10 nance and repair for each entities, the amount of the
11 subset of depot maintenance workload that meets
12 the description under section 2464 of title 10,
13 United States Code, that is performed in the public
14 and private sectors by direct labor hours and by dol-
15 lars.

16 (3) Of the subset referred to in paragraph (2),
17 the amount of depot maintenance workload per-
18 formed in the public and private sector by direct
19 labor hour and by dollars for each entity that would
20 otherwise be considered core workload under section
21 2462 of title 10, United States Code, but is not con-
22 sidered core because a weapon system or equipment
23 has not been declared a program of record.

24 (4) An identification and description of depot
25 level maintenance and repair workload occurring at

1 each installation that is outside of the scope of what
2 has been identified by the Secretary of the Army as
3 a Center of Industrial and Technical Excellence
4 under section 2474 of title 10, United States Code,
5 and an assessment whether that workload should be
6 occurring at another installation under such section.

7 (5) The projections for the upcoming future
8 years defense program.

9 (6) A business case analysis on incorporating
10 the depot-level maintenance and repair requirements
11 of the Department of Homeland Security and other
12 Federal agencies into the organic industrial base.
